Areas of learning and experience

Personal, social and emotional development

The children will be:

- making friends with the other children and extending their play through communication
- learning how to zip up their coats on their own
- learning how to look after their property such as hats and gloves
- continuing to learn about the rules of the classroom and school



Communication, language and literacy

The children will be encouraged to:

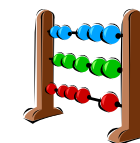
- take turns when speaking and listening to others
- continue to tell and act out their own stories
- retell familiar stories
- recognise and write their own name forming the letters correctly



Maths

The children will be encouraged to:

- understand the concept of number
- count objects and recognise numbers up to ten
- order and use numbers up to 10 confidently
- explore shape and space in their environment
- begin to solve mathematical problems

Understanding of the world

Exploration and investigation

The children will be encouraged to:

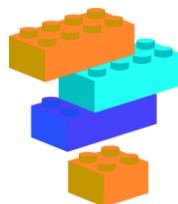
- explore ourselves
- continue to explore sand, water, dough, paint and collage, materials
- talk about what they 'see', 'hear' 'smell' 'taste' and 'feel'



Designing and making

The children will be encouraged to:

- construct with a purpose in mind
- make objects with junk materials and a variety of construction kits, both inside and in the outside area



Sense of time, sense of place

The children will be learning

- how they have changed since they were babies
- to observe and comment on the weather and changes in the seasons



Expressive Arts and Design

The children will be encouraged to:

- explore different materials and methods to create pictures
- use glue correctly to stick materials to paper
- listen to different pieces of music
- make up dances in response to music
- create stories in the small world area
- act out scenes from their own experiences or imagination



Physical development

The children will be encouraged to:

- follow instructions outside when doing physical activity such as running, climbing or playing with the wheeled vehicles
- continue to develop skills needed for handwriting by threading beads, using sewing cards, exercising fingers and using scissors



Links with home

We will

- welcome parents at all times and be available to discuss each child as needed
- send a newsletter home every week (via parent mail) keeping parents informed of events in the School and relevant dates
- meet with parents to discuss child's progress and set targets for their future learning
